Dear Friends:

In this month of January, we will focus once again as a parish on fostering priestly and religious vocations as you have done for a number of years through the Blessed Mother Teresa Vocation Group. We will invite you to pray even more fervently than you usually do for vocations and ask you to submit names to us of men and women whom you think show signs of a priestly or religious vocation.

My own vocation to the priesthood was fostered through the prayers and example of a number of people in the parish of my youth as I was growing up. The first one to ask was my pastor and dear friend, Fr. Cooper. When I was in first grade, he asked us all what we wanted to be when we grew up. I answered “a priest.” I never forgot that moment nor that question. As I answered that call by going to the seminary some years later, there were many people who prayed for me daily: my mom and dad, my sister and brother, Mandy Sullivan, Helen Saxton, Uncle Harold and Aunt Helen, Aunt Babe, Aunt Honey, Fr. John, Gerri Cragg, John and Liz Wascak, Bob and Isabel Williams, and many others from my family and parish. As time went on, others began to pray for me including many from our St. Jude Parish during and after I worked here in 1977-78 and before I was ordained. I have always considered St. Thomas Parish in Corry, PA, and our St. Jude Parish as the “homes” of my vocation. I have always been very thankful for these homes and the people and the prayers and ask you to continue to pray for me and Fr. Miguel.

You may have noticed that we are praying for priestly and religious vocations at each weekend Mass and are praying specifically for parish and diocesan vocations by name. I hope that as we pray for them by name it will become ever more real to us – both the people and the need!

Over the last several months, we have offered you through the bulletin the “condensed” biographies of a number of Saints and a variety of prayers for vocations (one from our Bishop, another from the Knights of Columbus, and another from the Serra Club) to encourage you to think about vocations and the holiness and joy that come from answering God’s call. Over this month, there will be a number of articles in the bulletin and ballots in the bulletin and in the pews. Please use the ballots to recommend to us those you perceive may have a vocation. Please don’t hesitate. Many times, priests, religious, seminarians, and novices have said “I was just waiting for someone to ask”!

Be that voice – be the voice of Christ – for those waiting and searching for his call!
