FREE THROW CONTEST TODAY

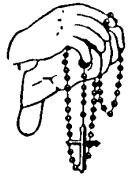

Serving for “God’s Sake”

“For God’s Sake, Do Something with Your Life.” Perhaps you read this statement on a banner that hung in St. Jude’s vestibule during a previous version of the parish’s vocation awareness program, *“Called to Serve God and Humanity.”* Granted, the phrase “for God’s sake” is abused and misused in everyday language by many, however its use with the vocation awareness program seemed so *very* appropriate. To do something for God’s sake is an awesome opportunity.

The word “vocation” means “a calling.” Everyone has a vocation of some sort. It does not necessarily mean a career, but a calling to serve. Some people are called to the married state, some to remain single, and others to particular occupations or particular ministries. Some are called to a variety of ministries. Still others are given a special calling, a calling to serve “for God’s sake,” as a priest or religious.

We are all somewhat familiar with priests and the role they have serving God by serving us, the members of the Church. The religious also serve God, but in ways many of us are not as familiar with. “Religious” vocations are those called to a life devoted in a special way to prayer and service. Nuns, sisters, brothers, and monks are examples of religious vocations. Nuns and monks tend to lead lives somewhat separated from the world and are devoted to a life of prayer for the many aspects of God’s kingdom. Sisters and brothers usually live a more visible ministry by serving the poor, or teaching in schools, or working in hospitals (ministering to those with a need).

Each priest or religious received a calling. Each could give a story of how God called them. For some it may have been something people saw in them and told them, (they heard the words) *“you would be a good priest”* or *“nun”* or *“brother,”* etc. For others it may have been a voice from within, a desire to serve, or a special admiration of the work that priests or religious do. Discerning “the call” requires prayer and openness to God’s will. Listen for the “vocation” that you may be receiving. Listen and decide if you are to do something “for God’s sake.”

If you think you might be receiving this special calling, take time to pray about it and sit down and talk with a priest or a member of a religious order. They would be glad to talk to you and share their “calling.”
