YOU HAVE NOT CHOSEN ME, I HAVE CHOSEN YOU

Perhaps you are thinking about a vocation. If so, you should trust in God and allow Him to direct you. The word “vocation,” as defined in the American Heritage Dictionary, is “an inclination, as if in response to a summons, to undertake a certain kind of work, especially a religious career.” Remember, you did not choose your vocation; on the contrary, your vocation was chosen for you by God. John 15:16 says, “It was not you who chose Me, but I who chose you and appointed you to go and bear fruit that will remain, so that whatever you ask the Father in my name, He may give you.” Also in Isaiah 43:16, God affirms, “I have called you by name, you are Mine.”

In the case of a vocation to the priesthood in particular, you may want to reflect on the following verses:

- 1 Peter 2:5 – Peter says, “And like living stones, let yourselves be built into a spiritual house to be a holy priesthood to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ.”
- John 10:14 – Jesus says, “I am the good shepherd, and I know mine and mine know me.”
- 1 Corinthians 7:17 – Paul says “Everyone should live as the Lord has assigned, just as God called each one.”
- Luke 18:29-30 – Jesus says, “Amen, I say to you, there is no one who has given up house or wife or brothers or parents or children for the sake of the kingdom of God who will not receive (back) an overabundant return in this present age and eternal life in the age to come.”

Among many, many different prayers for vocations, one of the more powerful comes from the Redemptorists and reads in part:

Send forth your Spirit, Lord, into the hearts of your faithful people, that we may be conscious of our vocation to holiness and service to others. Grant that many of us may dedicate ourselves to You through the priesthood, religious life, and lay ministries. We pray especially for the needs of our own parish and diocese. Grant that we may always have sufficient good and holy priests, dedicated sisters, and committed lay ministers to serve our communities.

Our beloved Pope John Paul II provided the following encouraging word on vocations:

Do not be afraid! Open the doors to Christ. God works in the concrete and personal affairs of each one of us. Don't let the time that the Lord gives you run on as if everything were due to chance. With this expression of my hope I send you all, from the depths of my heart, my blessing.

So, in closing, if you believe you have a calling to the religious life of the Catholic Church, remember it is not your choosing but God's. Take the time to meet with one of the wonderful priests in our parish/diocese and pursue this calling, for, “it was not you who chose Me, but I who chose you.”
